

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Feministic Reading of The First Grader: A Kenyan Movie by Justin Chadwick.

Film has evolved over time to combine its artistic qualities and its business potential to emerge as one of the world's most formidable cultural industries. The film industry is acknowledged globally as an important vehicle for social, cultural, political and economic development. It has globally become a powerful vehicle for culture, education, leisure and propaganda. Compared to other media, film is a young medium as it came into existence only a little more than a hundred years ago, much after dance, painting, literature, newspaper and theatre which have existed much longer.

Cinema is the most prestigious cultural activity in the modern world. It is for us what theatre was in the age of Shakespeare or painting was in the days of Leonardo da Vinci: the art form with the biggest impact, the largest budgets, and the most widespread audiences. Films are deliberately created to have

effects on their audiences and over the years, film has been identified as one of the best tools for social transformation. The film industry can be a magnet that draws communities together as it translates into a platform for their social, economic and even political debate and development. Film or motion pictures have emerged to be such an important part of our lives that it's hard to imagine life without them. As art, film is a combination of different art forms that include writing, dramatic performance, cinematography, music, editing etc.

According to David Bordwell "the audio-visual medium is widely recognized as a powerful form of communication, entertainment and by design; films have a massive influence on their audiences" (3).

There is very little published research on motion pictures in Kenya. This study was necessitated by the lack of publications on the film in Kenya.

Whatever secondary data exists, it is disjointed and scattered in many sources such as newspaper stories, magazine articles, individual and institutional websites, archival materials at the Kenya National Archives, academic journals, video productions, dissertations and thesis in academic institutions.

Since the first documentary was shot in Kenya in 1909, many other feature films and documentaries have been shot in Kenya and these films have shaped the identity of Kenya to the outside world during the changing historical epochs. Because to an extent films contribute to shaping the perception and

gauge how they represented Kenya's culture and rationalism in part or as a whole. The general objective of this study is to re-examine a movie by Justin Chadwick *The First Grader* with a female perspective. The way the movie is dramatized together with its other components like narrative strategies involved force us to think that it unfolds the story of Kimani N'gan'ga Maruge. The study focuses on analysing the movie not as the movie of Maruge, eighty four year old man who happens to be the benefactor of the free education newly promised by the Kenyan government, but as the movie of Jane Obinchu, the Head Teacher who is a woman.

With this objective in mind, the project is divided into three chapters. The first phase forms the introduction. The second phase deals with a close analysis of the movie to prove it as the story of Jane Obinchu, the Principal who is a woman. This chapter brings to light all the evidences needed to make her so. The last section is the conclusion which is followed by the references.

In an overcrowded primary school classroom, small children in blue gingham squeeze together on benches and on the packed earth floor. From among the tangle of youth protrudes an anachronistic body. Shoulders hunched over a child-sized desk in the front row, his walking staff leaning nearby, an eighty-four-year-old man strains to hear instructions on writing a lowercase letter a, holding a pencil awkwardly, he struggles. The teacher pauses to adjust his grip. Slowly and almost tenderly, he forms his first letter.

Justin Chadwick's FG dramatizes the true story of Kimani Ng'ang'a Maruge, an octogenarian and former Mau Mau freedom fighter who, in 2003, took seriously the Republic of Kenya's offer of free primary education and fought to enroll in a local primary school. Despite the school's over-enrollment and dire lack of resources, teacher Jane (played by Naomie Harris) eventually allows Maruge (Oliver Litondo) to join her class. The absurdity of Maruge's schoolboy knee-highs is only slightly diminished by the earnestness of his desire to learn how to read, write, and do simple maths. Although the real Maruge's story circulated in international media, The First Grader represents the most significant treatment of his story thus far. This will be the general impression of anyone who goes through the movie .On closer re-examination it happens to be an unwritten principle laying under the movie that FG is not the movie of an octogenarian but the movie of Jane Obinchu, the "SHE" teacher in it.

The role of Jane, the head teacher explicates women-hood throughout the movie. It is because the head teacher is a woman that Maruge, the old Mau Mau veteran in his eighties is able to learn and complete his dreams to read. In the outset itself, it is evidently shown how Jane's assistant in the school, Mr. Alfred tries to ridicule the old man's attempts to learn alphabets by ignoring him. When Maruge comes to the school for the first time to get admission Mr Alfred, blatantly tells him that they already has two hundred pupils in the school and

fifty benches .He also adds that they can't waste the space for an old man who is looking for his grave. And that all students need an exercise book and one sharpened pencil with rubber on one end to enter the school. But Maruge had the newspaper with him and he shows the new regulation of the Kenyan government that provides free education for all in it to her. After going through the newspaper, with all due respects she replies that:

Jane: It means children and not adults

Maruge: I've heard on the radio. With my own ears .

They said "everybody"

Although Jane stands looking at the old man in a helpless condition, one can read from her face the empathy, care and concern that every teacher has towards their disciples. Perhaps not, certainly it is the sensitivity and a kind of emotional and humanitarian bondage that Maruge reads from her face that instills a ray of hope in him.

The way Jane handles her encounter with Maruge on the second day again substantiates the deep regard she has towards the old man. Although she didn't permit him to join the school, she makes the excuse that she already has too many pupils over there, which exactly is the reality. Whereas, Alfred rejects him by saying that he cannot be admitted without uniform and shoes. He asserts

that Maruge will not be having enough money to buy shoes. He even misbehaves with the old man asking him to go home and rest in peace:

Alfred: Go home and rest in peace.

Maruge: Rest in peace? I'm not dead.

When Maruge makes his presence at the school gate for the third time, she was talking to Mr Kipruto, the School Inspector about the lack of facilities in the school," We have five children to a desk here sir, we have children sitting on the floor. We can't work like this Mr Kipruto" (Harding & Chadwick 2011).

Still, Jane goes to meet the old man who has come for the third time to get admission in the school. Despite the warnings of Mr Alfred she forcefully or rather assertively lets Maruge in. On seeing the old man she says:

Jane: You won't give up easily, do you Maruge?

Alfred: You can't fall for this. You will be asking for troubles with the authorities.

Jane: You know he is right Maruge. What would I say to the Board of Education? What would I say to the parents? Mm?

Maruge: I'll be a good pupil. I'll work very hard.

Alfred: If Kipruto finds out...

Jane: Kipruto is not the head here Alfred... I am...let him in. I'm taking an executive decision. Let Maruge in.

Jane exerts her authority over Alfred and she herself opens the gate and welcomes the old man. This particular instance undoubtedly proves the firmness, exactitude, courage and sensitivity shown by Jane Obinchu the real "SHEteacher" of the movie. It is all because the person who plays the role of principal is a woman that an eighty four year old man, Maruge got a chance to enter the premises of a primary school. Role of Alfred justifies this argument. Later when the media comes to have an interview with Maruge at school, Jane comes for his assistance. But Alfred was having the idea that Jane is bringing unnecessary attention from the public. The women helper of the school scolds Alfred saying that she hasn't seen a negative personality like him ever before. If at all Alfred was the principal of that school he wouldn't have let Maruge in and the old man would have missed the chance of being the Oldest man to have the primary education in Kenya.

Principal, Jane Obinchu is a model for all the teachers in this world because of many virtues that she posses. She gets intimate with the pupils in a psychological way. When she starts taking classes for the first time she tries to make her students at ease through her speech:

Jane: I'm so excited to have you all in this class room. Welcome, Karibooni. I know some of you are a little nervous, but there is nothing to be afraid of. Learning is about having fun. So we are all going to have fun here.

Has everybody got your books?

Children: Yes.

Jane: Has everybody got your pencils?

Children: No.

Jane asks again and arranges pencils for those who don't have it, wiping away fear from her pupils' mind.

In another scene when she goes through the homework of the students in the class she makes use of her innate skills in teaching. While going through their homework she makes use of every opportunity to appreciate her pupils. When one boy writes number five incorrectly she warns him and asks him to rewrite it. In that way she makes use of her talent in teaching in the best way possible. The children also respond in a positive way. It is her kindness and expertise in dealing with the students that wins their heart in the end. All these are possible just because Jane is a woman.

In another instance, when Alfred comes inside the class to check neatness and hygiene of the students he scolds Maruge for the reason that his pencil is very blunt. He also instructs the old man that he should sharpen the pencil then

itself. When Maruge falters in front of the sharpening machine Jane rushes towards him, holds him and takes him outside the class to have some fresh air. This is one among the many scenes in which Jane satisfies the role of central character of the movie.

The courage and confidence shown by this lady teacher is unbelievable. When Mr Kipruto warns her for admitting Maruge in the primary school she pleads on behalf of the old man that since the British had killed his family it is their duty to help him. But her pleas fall in deaf ears. And accordingly Maruge had to join in an adult school. But later when Maruge quits going there because of the lack of learning atmosphere, Jane is courageous enough to make Maruge her Teaching Assistant, an executive decision that nobody can deny. That also throws light on her decision making power often spontaneous.

The film clearly talks about the story of Jane who welcomed Maruge to the school. The radio announcement also states the importance of the teacher who permitted the old man "The world is finally talking about Maruge, Maruge. I'm thinking about the teacher who took Maruge at eighty four. Unbelievable!" (Harding & Chadwick 2011).

She had to fight hard because of the humanitarian consideration that she had on Maruge. There were protests from the part of authorities and parents. A woman accuses her saying that she only cares about herself and getting her

pictures in the news paper. But she was able to defend herself. In an assertive tone she says that; "Every single child is important to me including your son" (Harding & Chadwick 2011).

Parents gets enraged and they assemble in front of the school gate in an agitated mood. Jane desperately tries to control the mob by saying that the children have many things to learn from the old. She even goes for an argument with Mr. Kipruto, who happens to visit the place at that time. She never loses her reasoning while arguing with Kipruto, which gives her the traits of a good leader. She starts getting phone calls often threatening her but she remains unmoved.

She is firm in her value system with a strong sense of personality. When she receives transfer to Turkana which is three hundred miles away from her residence she says that she won't resign. It was against the wishes of her husband, Charles Obinchu. Jane didn't showcase any fits of anger or resentment in her arguments with her husband. But she listens and very firmly and convincingly gets across the point that women must be seen not heard and that she is taking the transfer.

At the scenes of departure, one can see maturity in the characterisation of Jane. She bids goodbye to Maruge by visiting him in person. Although taking leave her counsels had an astounding impact on him. She told Maruge one of

the sayings given by her father who was a fisher man. My father had a saying: "Learning never ends until you have got soil in your ears." (Harding & Chadwick 2011).

Maruge had taken this advice of his teacher as his life's principle from that very day onwards. When at the end of the movie Maruge says that he wants to become a veterinarian he recounts the saying taking inspiration out of it. The words she shared with her pupils are also touching and motivational. That might be one reason why children pestered their new teacher Ms Grace Muthumba with stones. Children couldn't imagine another teacher in the place of Jane. The initiative to close the school gate in front of the new teacher and to throw stones at her came from the side of the children. When a few threw slippers at the gate, drawn by the same energy and enthusiasm every single child in the school took part in their little revolt which forced the authorities to call back Ms Jane from Turkana. It shows how influential Jane is. This single incident together with other incidents of the movie examined so far undoubtedly proves that the movie under discussion that is FG, by all means of the term is a movie of Jane Obinchu.

Public reception of a movie is an inevitable perspective behind the making of every new movie. The film makers struggle a lot in incorporating the essentials needed to gather commercial attention to their movies. The makers of the movie FG also struggled a lot in bringing it under limelight. To cite Bowen:

Set and shot in Kenya with many Kenyan cast and crew members, The First Grader was devised and distributed primarily within western contexts which was independently inspired by a 2005 article about Maruge reported in the Los Angeles Times . Screenwriter Ann Peacock teamed up to turn Maruge's story into a film. Unable to secure sufficient financial backing in the United States, they eventually partnered with the United Kingdom's BBC Films and Origin Pictures, with the further support of the UK Film Council and Video-vision Entertainment of South Africa . Following showings at film festivals in North America, Western Europe, and Western Asia in 2010, the film was distributed in American theatres by National Geographic Entertainment in 2011. With this largely western-based production and distribution history, it is reasonable to approach the film as one catering primarily to western audiences. An interest in appealing to American viewers is further suggested by the film's contrived references to the political climate of the United States. The film is among other things, an ode to education, to persistence, and to the power of the written word—a celebratory theme common in western cultures in which both compulsory, state-funded education and intergenerational culture clashes have relatively long histories.

That might be one of the reasons why its makers concentrated on giving the tale of a man rather than giving importance to the lady teacher who is exactly responsible for the change that is considering an old man in a primary institution just by considering his quest for knowledge. Lots of other perspectives can be associated to the movie apart from its feminist reading. Despite the story's origins in Kenyan contexts, audiences cannot approach FG as a legitimate representation of literacy and aging in Eastern African contexts so much as a reflection of western attitudes toward literacy and aging. Although a film of British-style systems of partly about healing from the traumas of British imperialism, FG captures and in some ways challenges the popular desire to erase tribal history in favour education and government.

The character of Jane Obinchu stands aloft as a beacon light overflowing with typical values of a women academician throughout the movie. She is confident, courageous, arguing, honest, kind, loving, dedicated to her ideals and demanding several times. In Jane one can see perfect package of energy and enthusiasm, spontaneity and versatility together with sound reasoning. She knows very well how to manage her subordinates often authoritatively without causing ill feeling. Mr Alfred gets continuously sued whenever he tries to misbehave with Maruge.

Even when Kipruto comes and forces her to expel Maruge she resists to the maximum. In the climax she goes to Nairobi to speak to the Madam -in -

towards a Mau Mau veteran and the responsibility that Kenya is having towards him. It shows her commitment to her profession. In the outset it is Jane's independent executive decision that provides Marugo the golden opportunity to get enrolled in the school. The movie is replete with such instances of spontaneity, fortitude and boldness that any woman who is a manager should keep and execute to bring about changes in the immediate society she is a part of. In this regard, Jane Obinchu is a perfect role model for posterity forever.

Taking in to consideration all the instances given in Chapter II, undoubtedly the movie FG is the movie of the" SHE-teacher", Jane Obinchu.


