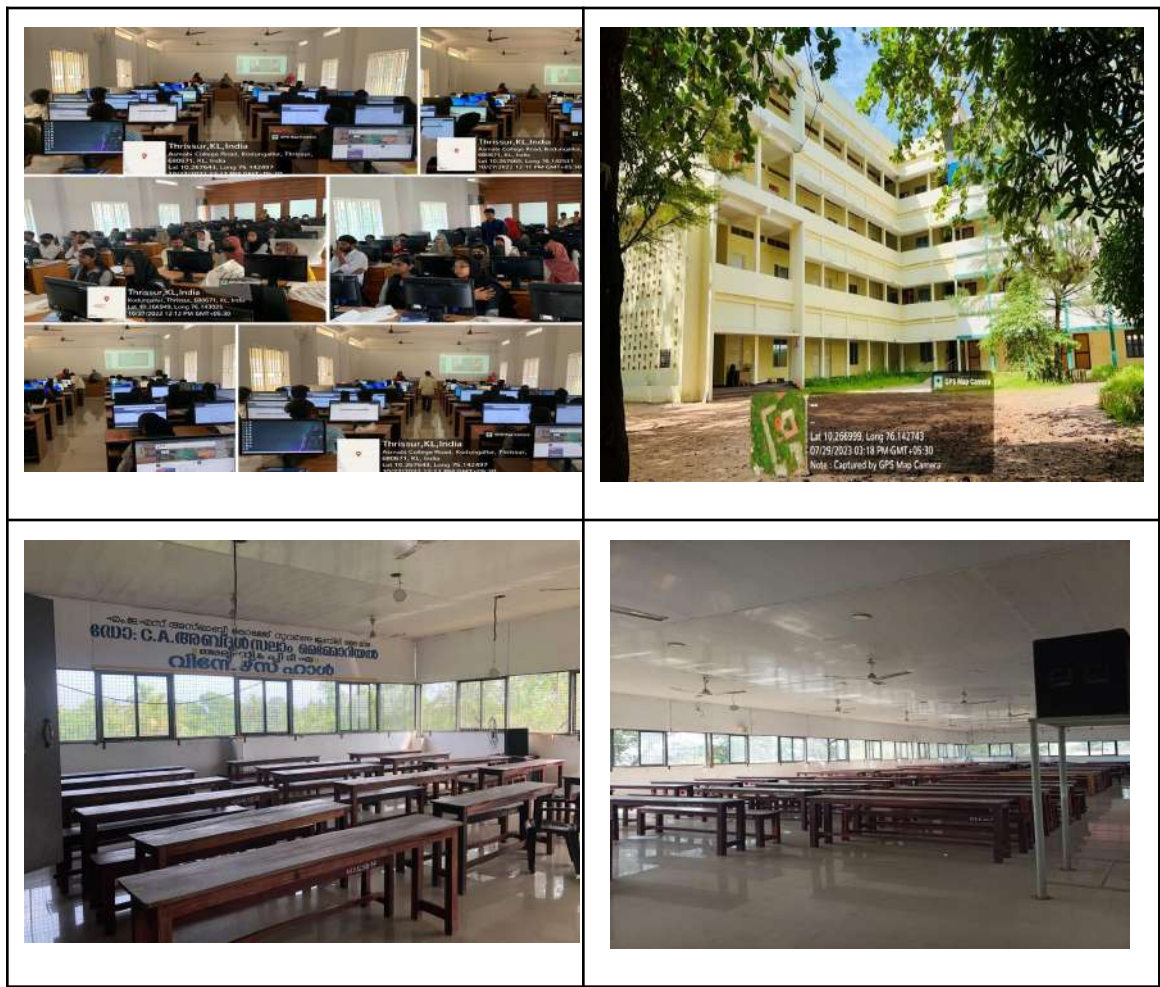


Figure 3: Computer Lab, Commerce Block and Seminar Hall

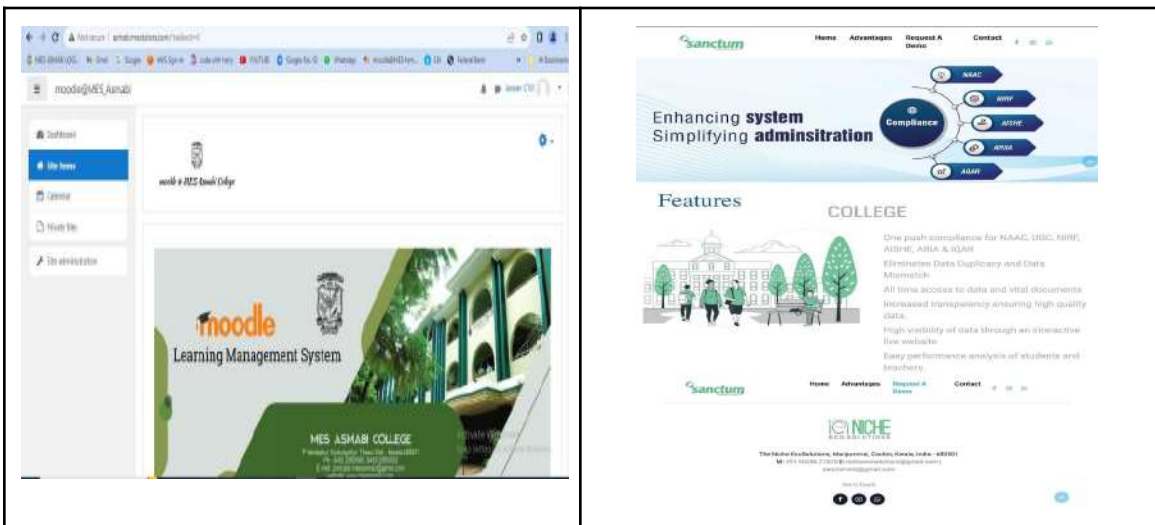


Figure 5: Moodle LMS platform and ERP

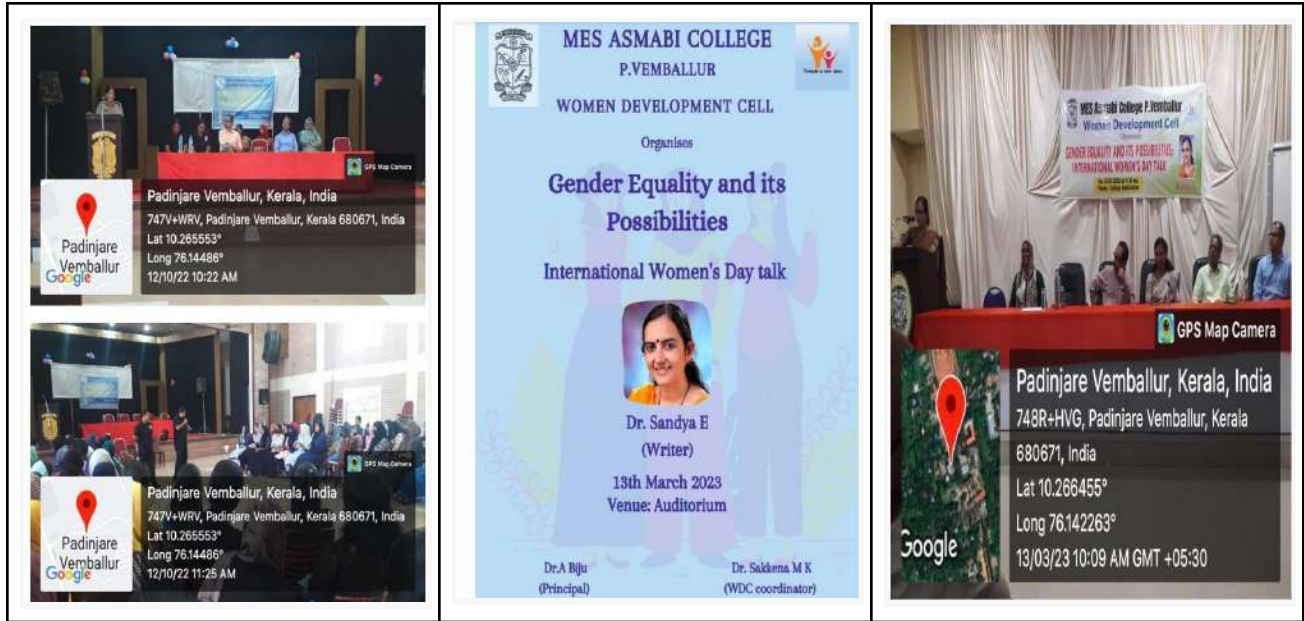


Figure 9 (C): Programme conducted by WDC Unit

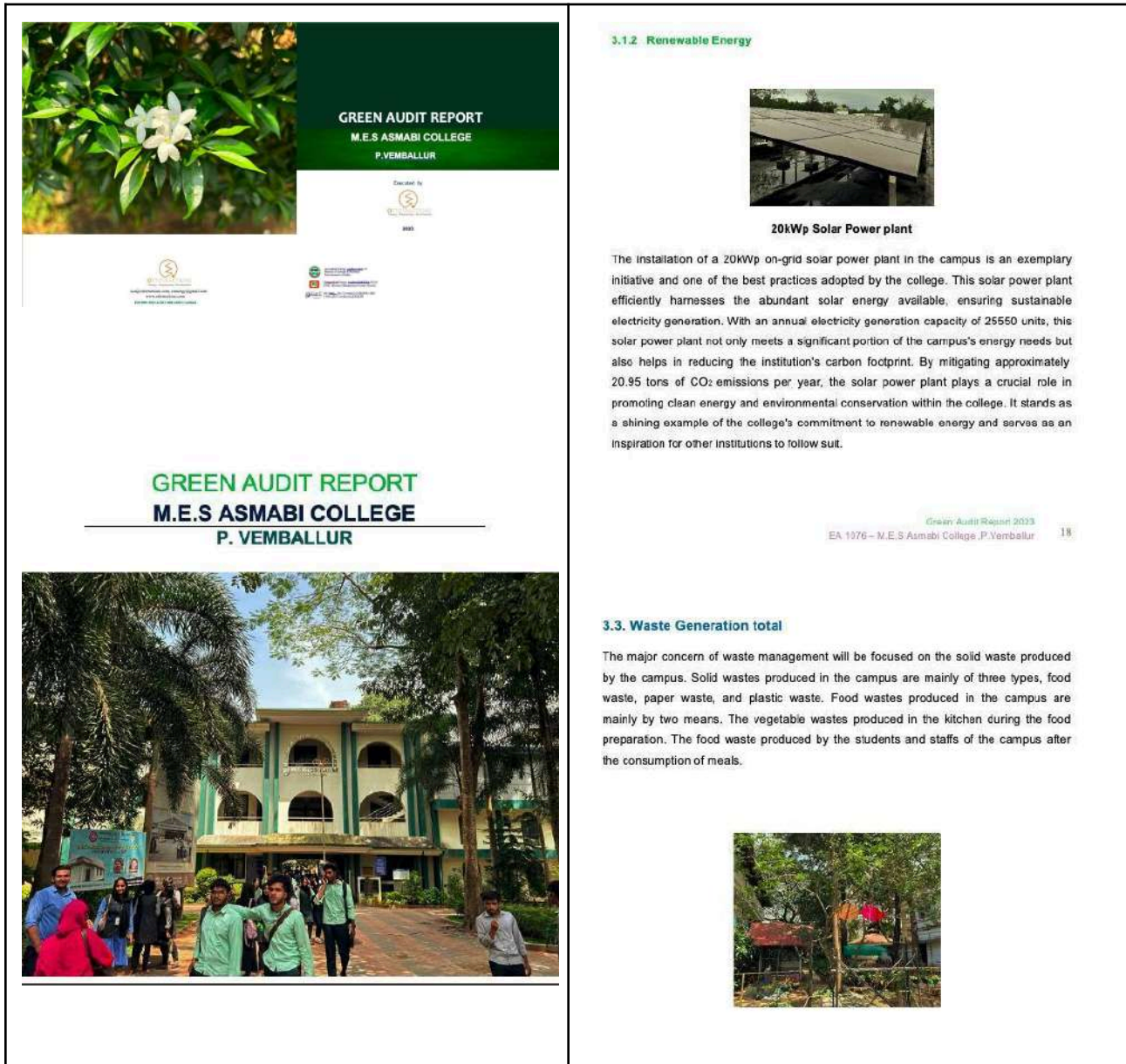



Figure 13: Green Audit Report
