Stemming from the distinguished relations between the Muslim Educational Society in India (hereinafter referred to as MES), and the University of Technology and Applied Sciences in the Sultanate of Oman (hereinafter referred to as UTAS), and the desire of both Parties to promote and develop cooperation between them in the field of higher education, research and innovation in the disciplines of engineering, technology, economics, business administration, design, creative industries, applied sciences, and pharmacy based on reciprocal benefit, and in light of the discussions held between the Parties in this regard, and as per the terms and conditions set forth in this Program of Cooperation, the following has been agreed:

**Article 1**

The Parties shall encourage cooperation in the following areas:

- a) Exchange studies, research findings and publications, academic teaching resources, and other educational programs of common interests;
- b) Exchange information on teaching, learning material, and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs;
- c) Jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and invite faculty of the Parties to participate therein;
- d) Jointly organize seminars, conferences, or workshops on topics of mutual interest and invite faculty of the Parties to participate therein;
- e) Jointly propose and engage in research or training programs sponsored by funding agencies and invite faculty of the Parties to participate therein;

- f) Exchange, on a reciprocal basis, students at undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral levels for limited periods for the purpose of education and /or research.

The parties may add other files for cooperation by direct agreement as per the mutual interests, striving to achieve excellence in the process of teaching, learning, scientific research, student exchange, knowledge dissemination, and quality enhancement.

### **Article 2**

The Parties shall encourage cooperation in the areas of research, development, and consulting, with the participation of faculty members.

### **Article 3**

The Parties shall encourage the exchange of faculty, staff and expert visits in the cooperation fields referred to in Article 1 and Article 2.

### **Article 4**

The Parties shall facilitate the student exchange in accordance with the capabilities and the applicable laws and regulations of each Party in this regard.

### **Article 5**

The Parties shall consider the exchange of scientific and technical material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs while respecting each Party's intellectual property and other associated rights. Further, the intellectual property rights arising from any collaborative research or activity under this Program will be worked out on a case-by-case basis and will be consistent with the officially laid down IPR policies of the two institutions.

### **Article 6**

The Parties shall conduct and attend joint conferences, workshops, and short-term courses.

#### **Article 7**

Each Party shall appoint a representative to be responsible for liaison with one another and to communicate, submit and receive any requests or correspondence in connection with the implementation of the provisions of this Program. Each party shall notify the other in writing of the representative's identity, address, and appropriate means of contacting them within fifteen days from the date of signing.

If any party wishes to change or replace the representative appointed in the above clause, or if the appointed representative changes their address or means of communication, he/ she must notify the other party in writing within fifteen days of the date of the change.

#### **Article 8**

The Parties shall agree to use their best endeavors to amicably settle any disputes arising out of the implementation or interpretation of the provisions of this Program through good faith discussion and negotiation to reach a satisfactory resolution.

#### **Article 9**

The Parties, through their employees and those in charge of the implementation of this Program, shall maintain the confidentiality of the information circulated during the implementation period and shall not disclose, or transfer any information without obtaining prior written consent of the other Party to publish or disclose it.

#### **Article 10**

No provision of this Program shall require any financial obligation for each Party or incur any potential financial liability in the implementation of its cooperative activities.

#### **Article 11**

The Parties may amend this Program based on mutual agreement between them.





### Article 12

This Program comes into effect from the date of its signature for a period of five years. It shall be automatically extended for other similar periods unless one of the Parties notifies the other in writing of its intention to terminate at least six months prior to the date of termination.

This Program was signed in 18 Aug 2023 on Friday corresponding to 1st of Safar 1445 in two originals in Arabic and English, both of which have legal authority.

In case of disagreement, the English text shall prevail.
