'GRAMIKA'

In line with Mahatma Gandhi's belief that "The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others," MES Asmabi College embarked on a socially responsible initiative prior to the Covid era. This outreach program aimed to foster socially conscious individuals through the integration of NSS, NCC, and department-specific extension activities.

On February 7, 2018, all departments actively participated in Gramika, showcasing a diverse array of activities. The event encompassed initiatives such as the cleaning of Okhi-affected wards, the distribution of notices promoting energy conservation, and conducting awareness classes on Disaster Management. Additional efforts included a biodiversity survey and health and hygiene programs in the Okhi-affected area, as well as awareness sessions on lifestyle diseases.

Moreover, participants engaged in crafting activities utilizing waste materials, parenting classes focusing on 'Understanding the Child,' support for the school library, games, and entertainment for school children. The event extended its impact to the community through activities like online PSC registration, an internet awareness class for Kudumbasree members, and an eye camp. Other significant contributions involved training and awareness seminars for value-added fishery products, an immunization campaign targeting infants, children, and pregnant women, and an activity-oriented communicative enhancement training program for students at a Government AMLP school. The collective efforts showcased the dedication and commitment of all departments towards the holistic development and well-being of the community.

On January 23, 2020, the college organised e-waste management activities as part of Gramika. Despite electronic waste being a previously unnoticed and untreated source of pollution, increased awareness has become crucial. Researchers and social activists have shed light on the environmental impact of electronic waste. In response, the college initiated awareness drives and e-waste collection events in collaboration with the local Grama Panchayat, striving to educate rural communities on responsible disposal practices.

'EXPERIA'

MES Asmabi College implements Experia, experiential learning through community intervention, offering students a hands-on education that actively involves them with the local community. This approach goes beyond traditional classrooms, allowing students to gain practical experience and a profound understanding of real-world challenges. Whether it is organizing camps, environmental initiatives, or educational programmes, students develop critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and a strong sense of social responsibility.

Experiential learning through active involvement in social service activities is one of the focal points of student attributes targeted by MES Asmabi college. The Experia, E-waste collection drive, executed on February 28, involved all students, except those in their third year, covering all 21 wards under Sree Narayana Puram Grama Panchayat. This active engagement in social service activities is aimed at instilling social orientation, especially in challenging situations, contributing to a more holistic understanding of the world.

"Gramika"; the social service-cum-extension activities of the college was held on 23rd January 2020. The programme mainly focused on E-waste management activities: Electronic waste forms an alarming source of pollution which goes unnoticed and unattended due to its uniqueness as seemingly harmless nature. But the scenario has changed recently due to exposure of its toxic nature thanks to interference by researchers, and social activists. Still awareness needs to be disseminated to rural areas in a situation where the number of people using electronic gadgets and electronic/electrical home appliances is increasing day after day. Rural homes are becoming dumping yards of unused, damaged and/or outdated electronic gismos. Awareness drives and collection of e-wastes can tremendously contribute to the reduction in electronic waste to some extent. The awareness programme and e-waste collection with the involvement of Grama Panchayath authorities are envisioned as a sincere attempt in this direction.











Flood Relief Activities

The devastating floods of 2018 in Kerala marked one of the worst natural disasters in Kerala history. Starting in late May and intensifying in August, incessant rainfall triggered widespread flooding and landslides across various districts of Kerala. The deluge affected millions of people causing significant loss of life, displacing thousands and inflicting extensive damage to infrastructure, homes and agriculture. As a socially committed educational institution, MES Asmabi College played its role in rebuilding Kerala. As per the direction from MES authorities, MES Asmabi College college mobilised 300 members to participate in a one day initiative to clean and provide services to various flood affected institutions in the Kuttanad region of Alappuzha district.

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


Team 3 – Giving Emotional Support (Psychosocial Support) Communicating with Covid affected person on phone and Covid affected family, etc.
