7. NAAC EXECUTIVE SUMMARY EVALUATION

• CRITERION I- CURRICULAR ASPECTS

The college has 17 undergraduate courses and 6 postgraduate programmes with an enriched curriculum that integrates crosscutting issues relevant to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment, and sustainability into the curriculum. Two department, offer PhD programmes. College offers certificate programmes and many value added programmes and also organized different types of curriculum enrichment programmes for students. Curriculum and syllabus outlines are clearly stated in the college diary & handbook and the same is distributed among students and teachers. The institution offers academic programmes which are well in tune with the institution's goals and objectives and judicious selection of curricular and co-curricular activities are designed to foster the all round development of the students. Institution obtains feedback of the institution from various stake holders such as Students, Teachers, Employers, Alumni etc.

CRITERION II- TEACHING LEARNING AND EVALUATION

The demand ratio and enrolment percentage of various courses are high in the college. Lecture method coupled with techno-pedagogy is adopted for effective implementation of the curriculum. Care is taken to make teaching- learning process experimental, demonstrative and interactive. Hands-on training in skill based courses like B.Voc

courses enable them to actuate their latent interest in industry. Majority of the classrooms are equipped with projectors, laptops and Wi-Fi. The technology enabled environment encourages students and teachers to try ICT resources. The internal evaluation is based on a predetermined transparent system involving attendance in the classroom, assignments, seminars and periodic written tests etc. OBE is practiced in all programmes and the attainment results in the internal examinations are analyzed department-wise and corrective measures are taken when the level of attainment is below the expected level. The number of PhD holders among the faculty is 22 in the current academic year. Many of the faculty members are present in various academic bodies like Board of studies and syllabus revision committee. The pass percentage of various courses should be improved.

• CRITERION III- RESEARCH, INNOVATION AND EXTENSION

The college has two research centers- Botany and Commerce .A total of 8 faculties and 13 PhD scholars are working under their guidance. The number of research publication is less, and therefore, it should be increased. Regarding the extension and outreach programmes, 11 programmes were organized in association with NSS, NCC etc. The college received two awards for the extension activities. Good amount of grant is obtained for research in the college from various agencies including one major project and three minor projects. 19 research papers were published by the faculties in the current academic year. The IIC, IEDC and IPR cells organised various programmes in the college.

• CRITERION IV- INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

College always provides ample facilities and equipment to facilitate effective teaching and learning. The existing academic blocks of the institution have 62 well maintained and well-furnished classrooms. Classrooms are well-furnished and ventilated with sufficient number of lights and fans. All the second and final year U.G class rooms have the state-of-the-art-audio-visual facilities which include LCD projectors & speakers and all the P.G. class rooms have adequate ICT facilities. The campus of the institute houses a sports ground, auditorium, gymnasium & fitness centre and special rooms for NCC and NSS. Koha Software version 16, DSpace are used in the library for automation purpose. The Campus is facilitated with sufficient no. of computers. There are desktops

in all departments of the college with internet facility.

• CRITERION V- STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

The student support programme of the college is satisfactory. Above 80% of students receive government or non-government scholarships and free ships. Alumni, management and staff club also contribute towards the scholarships of students. The co-curricular activities including cultural and sports activities of the college is also remarkable. Various skill-oriented programmes are conducted regularly in the college for the students. The alumni contribution towards the student support is outstanding. The activities of various clubs and forums in student support programmes is also remarkable. The placement of students should be promoted in the college by organizing various placement drives.

• CRITERION VI- GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

The governance and leadership of the college focused on sustained institutional growth through its short term and long-term institutional perspective plans. Clubs, cells and various committees are headed by faculties and members are students. The college has an elaborate system in place to formulate and implement its policies and programmes to ensure efficient operations. This system includes both statutory and non-statutory bodies that operate in accordance with the regulations, guidelines and policies set by the Government, the University, and the College's Governing body. The institution has introduced effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff. All welfare measures introduced by the government like pension, gratuity, provident fund, group accident insurance, ESI, maternity and paternity leaves, medical reimbursement, encashment of surrender leave, medical leave and half pay leave, loan facilities, festival advance for employees, FDP for eligible candidates as per the UGC guidelines and state government norms, loans from the provident fund, sanctioning of leave for faculty improvement programmes, etc. are made available to all the permanent staff, consistent with the existing government rules.

CRITERION VII- INSTITUTIONAL VALUES AND BEST PRACTICES

Being a minority institution located in a coastal district the MES Asmabi college accommodates a wide range of culturally and socioeconomically diverse students and faculties in the campus. The majority of the students are girls from various minority categories along with economically weaker sections from the forward class. The institution is dedicated to promoting gender justice, equal opportunities, and democratic freedom for all. The college has introduced a uniform dress code to its students which ensures that there will be no distinction based on financial and economic status among students. Institute addresses gender equity through an inclusive environment and a wide range of curricular and co-curricular activities. The institution promotes comprehensive, high standards of morals and ethics, mutual respect and endurance among students by initiating celebrations and observances of commemorative days, events and festivals.
