Dr. A. Biju, the Principal of MES Asmabi College, delivered a felicitation speech, expressing gratitude to the resource person, attendees, and organizers.





Key Objectives of the Workshop:


- 1. To introduce innovative and student-centric teaching methodologies.



Session 1: Dr. Sunil Job, Director of Training & Corporate Services at IPSR, led an informative and engaging interaction session on the concept and architecture of OBE.




