


10th & 11th August 2022


INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR ON "ARABIC LANGUAGE LEARNING: NEW APPROACHES AND METHODS"




WEBINAR ON "LANGUAGE STUDIES AFTER CORONA"




DEPARTMENT OF MALAYALAM AND IQAC






NATIONAL WEBINAR ON MENTAL HEALTH FOR ALL- GREATER INVESTMENT, GREATER ACCESS

Topic: Covid 19 and Women Migrant Workers: Addressing the Less Addressed


Speaker: Dr. Divya Balan
