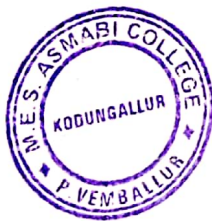
Evaluation Procedures:

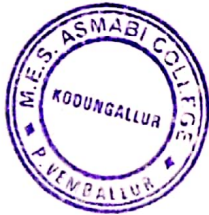

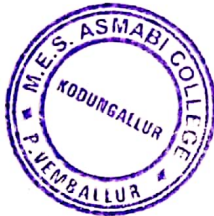
