REPORT ON WORKSHOP ON GRAPHIC DESIGN USING CANVA APP

Workshop Report on PO and CO Attainment Evaluation Based on Outcome-Based Education Using Bloom's Taxonomy


On Tuesday, 8th August 2023, the IQAC organized a workshop on Program Outcomes (PO) and Course Outcomes (CO) attainment evaluation, with a focus on outcomebased education (OBE) and Bloom's taxonomy. Held in the computer lab at 2:30 PM, the event featured Dr. Shahija VA, an expert in educational assessment, as the keynote speaker. The workshop commenced with a welcome address by Dr. A Biju, Principal, who underscored the importance of OBE in enhancing student learning outcomes. Dr. Shahija's session provided a comprehensive overview of OBE, delineating the distinctions between traditional education and OBE, and explaining the definitions and examples of PO and CO. She elaborated on Bloom's taxonomy, detailing the six cognitive levels and demonstrating how they apply to educational assessment. Techniques for mapping CO to PO, along with strategies for effective evaluation and continuous improvement, were discussed. Real-world case studies and practical examples were used to illustrate successful OBE implementation. The workshop concluded with an interactive Q&A session, where participants sought advice on challenges faced in OBE implementation. PROGRAM REPORT: SCHOLARSHIP ORIENTATION PROGRAMME 2023






PROGRAMME REPORT: MEET THE STUDENT ENTREPRENEURS

FEEDBACK SURVEYS

In the 2023-24 academic year, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a comprehensive feedback survey, collecting responses from a diverse range of stakeholders, including students, faculty, alumni, and employers. The feedback was meticulously analyzed to gauge satisfaction levels, identify strengths, and pinpoint areas for improvement within the institution. The survey covered aspects such as curriculum relevance, teaching effectiveness, infrastructure adequacy, and overall institutional environment. The findings highlighted high satisfaction in areas such as faculty expertise and student support services while identifying needs for enhancements in laboratory facilities and extracurricular opportunities. The results of the survey were discussed in IQAC meetings and used to inform strategic planning and quality improvement initiatives, demonstrating the institution's commitment to continuous quality enhancement and stakeholder engagement.

ANALYSED PROGRESSION TO HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT

The IQAC analyzed the progression data for the 2023-24 academic year, revealing that out of the graduating cohort, 251 students advanced to higher education, and 99 students secured employment. This analysis provided critical insights into the institution's effectiveness in preparing students for their next steps, whether in academia or the workforce. The data was collected through follow-up surveys and institutional records, ensuring accuracy and comprehensiveness. The findings indicated a healthy balance between students pursuing further studies and those entering the job market, reflecting the institution's dual focus on academic excellence and career readiness. The progression analysis will inform future curriculum development, career counseling services, and partnerships with industries and higher education institutions, aiming to enhance student outcomes and alignment with labor market demands.

IQAC CONDUCTED AAA INTERNAL AUDIT

The IQAC conducted an Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) for the 2023-24 academic year, led by the Principal, IQAC Coordinator, and IQAC members. The audit aimed to evaluate the institution's academic and administrative processes, ensuring they align with best practices and regulatory standards. The AAA process included a review of

departmental activities, faculty performance, student academic progress, administrative efficiency, and resource utilization. The audit findings highlighted areas of excellence, such as innovative teaching methodologies and robust student support services, as well as areas needing improvement, such as record-keeping practices and inter-departmental communication. The outcomes of the audit were discussed in a detailed report, with recommendations provided to departments and administrative units for enhancing their operations. This audit is part of the institution's ongoing commitment to maintaining high standards and fostering a culture of continuous improvement.

PREPARED PREVIOUS YEAR AQAR FOR SUBMISSION IN THE NAAC PORTAL

The AQAR was submitted to the NAAC portal, marking an essential step in the institution's accreditation process and reflecting its commitment to transparency and accountability in quality assurance.

IOAC ORGANIZED DEPARTMENTAL VISITS TO VERIFY FILES

As part of its quality assurance activities, the IQAC organized departmental visits to verify documentation and ensure compliance with institutional and accreditation standards. These visits involved the IQAC team reviewing various departmental files, including academic records, faculty credentials, research documentation, and student evaluation records. The objective was to assess the accuracy, completeness, and organization of these documents, which are critical for both internal review processes and external audits. During these visits, the IQAC provided feedback to departments, identifying best practices and areas for improvement in documentation and record-keeping. This initiative aimed to enhance

transparency, accountability, and consistency in departmental operations, thereby supporting the institution's overall quality assurance framework. The findings from these visits were compiled into a report, which was shared with department heads for follow-up action.

IQAC CONDUCTED STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

The IQAC conducted a comprehensive Student Satisfaction Survey to evaluate the effectiveness of the teaching-learning process within the institution. The survey solicited student feedback on various aspects, including the quality of teaching, the accessibility of faculty, the relevance of the curriculum, the adequacy of learning resources, and the overall academic environment. The results revealed a high level of student satisfaction, particularly with the quality of instruction and the supportive nature of faculty interactions. Students also expressed appreciation for the institution's efforts to incorporate modern teaching aids and technologies. However, the survey highlighted areas for potential improvement, such as the need for more practical exposure and enhanced extracurricular activities. The survey results have been instrumental in guiding the institution's strategic initiatives aimed at further enhancing the student learning experience and fostering a conducive academic environment.

IQAC INITIATED VARIOUS CERTIFICATE COURSES

The IQAC spearheaded the initiative to introduce various certificate courses aimed at enhancing students' skills and employability. During the 2023-24 academic year, 24 certificate courses were offered, covering diverse fields such as digital marketing, data analytics, soft skills, and advanced computing. These courses attracted a total enrollment of 2090 students, indicating strong interest and engagement from the student body. The initiative was designed to complement the regular academic curriculum, providing students with additional qualifications and practical skills that are highly valued in the job market. The courses were delivered through a mix of online and offline modes, facilitated by industry experts and experienced faculty members. The success of this initiative underscores the institution's commitment to providing holistic education and fostering a culture of lifelong learning among students.

RESULTS OF 2023-24

The IQAC conducted a detailed analysis of the academic results for the 2023-24 academic year, focusing on student performance and degree completion rates. The analysis revealed that 350 students qualified to receive their degrees, reflecting the institution's strong academic support system and effective teaching methodologies. The data was broken down by department, program, and demographic factors, providing insights into areas of academic strength and those requiring additional support. The analysis also highlighted trends in student performance, such as improvements in pass rates and grade distributions compared to previous years. The findings from this analysis are being used to inform curriculum reviews, faculty development programs, and student support services. The goal is to continue enhancing the quality of education provided and to ensure that all students are well-prepared for their future careers or further studies.

IQAC PREPARED AND SUBMITTED FOURTH CYCLE SSR

The IQAC successfully prepared and submitted the Self Study Report (SSR) for the fourth cycle of NAAC accreditation during the 2023-24 academic year. The SSR is a comprehensive document that details the institution's academic, administrative, and infrastructural developments, as well as its achievements in quality assurance and enhancement. The preparation of the SSR involved a thorough self-evaluation process, including inputs from faculty, students, staff, and other stakeholders. The report highlighted significant accomplishments since the last accreditation cycle, such as increased research output, expanded academic programs, and improved student services. The submission of the SSR is a critical component of the NAAC accreditation process, demonstrating the institution's commitment to maintaining high standards of quality in all its operations.
