5. **Networking:** The seminar provided a platform for networking and knowledge exchange among the attendees, fostering a sense of community and shared learning.

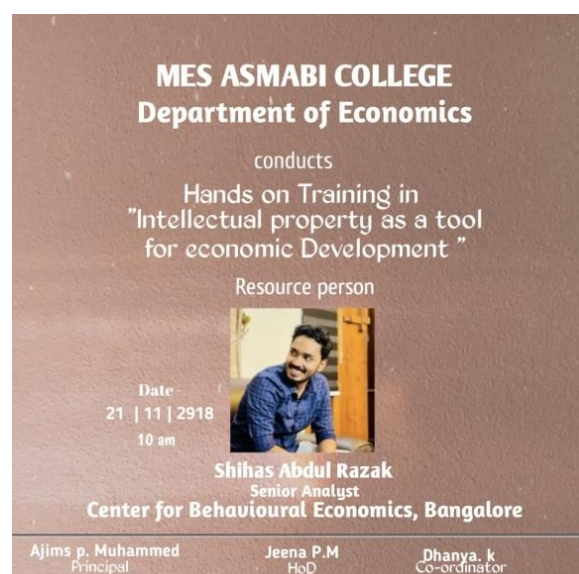
Conclusion:
