REPORT ON 'AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON DRUG ABUSE - A SOCIAL EVIL AND HEALTH HAZARD

The Department of Aquaculture at M.E.S. Asmabi College, in association with the National Service Scheme (NSS), conducted an anti-drug awareness programme for the first-semester B.Sc. Aquaculture students. The session was held in Room No. 401 on October 16, 2023, from 11:40 AM to 12:30 PM. The keynote speaker for the event was Sri. Shamnad, Excise Inspector of Kodungallur. The lecture focused on the health hazards caused by drugs and narcotics and the pervasive issue of drug spread as a social problem. The session was introduced by Dr. K. Kesavan, Head of the Department of Aquaculture.

Programme Details

Welcome and Introduction

The event commenced with Dr. K. Kesavan warmly welcoming the students and introducing the guest speaker, Sri. Shamnad. Dr. Kesavan emphasized the importance of awareness programs in combating drug abuse and highlighted the role of educational institutions in addressing this critical issue.

Lecture by Sri. Shamnad

- **Crime and Violence**: The connection between drug abuse and increased crime rates was a significant part of the lecture. Sri. Shamnad explained how drug addiction often leads individuals to engage in criminal activities to sustain their habit, contributing to higher crime rates and societal instability.
- **Preventive Measures**: To conclude his lecture, Sri. Shamnad discussed various preventive measures that can be adopted to combat drug abuse. He stressed the importance of education, community support programs, and stringent law enforcement to curtail the spread of drugs.

Student Interaction and Q&A

Following the lecture, there was a lively interaction session where students asked insightful questions. Sri. Shamnad patiently answered each query, providing further clarity on the issues discussed. He encouraged students to stay informed and be vigilant against the dangers of drug use.

Conclusion

Dr. K. Kesavan concluded the session by thanking Sri. Shamnad for his enlightening talk and the students for their active participation. He reiterated the importance of such awareness programs in resulting in a drug-free society and encouraged students to disseminate the knowledge gained to their peers and community.
