


RAMOJI FILM CITY VISIT- REPORT

Students were introduced to the advanced techniques of motion capture and green screen technology, essential for creating special effects and realistic animations in films.


The group explored the art of Foley sound, understanding how everyday objects are used to create realistic sound effects that enhance the audio experience in films.
