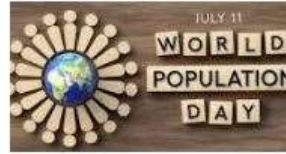
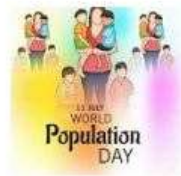
Population Day Celebration by the Department of Economics

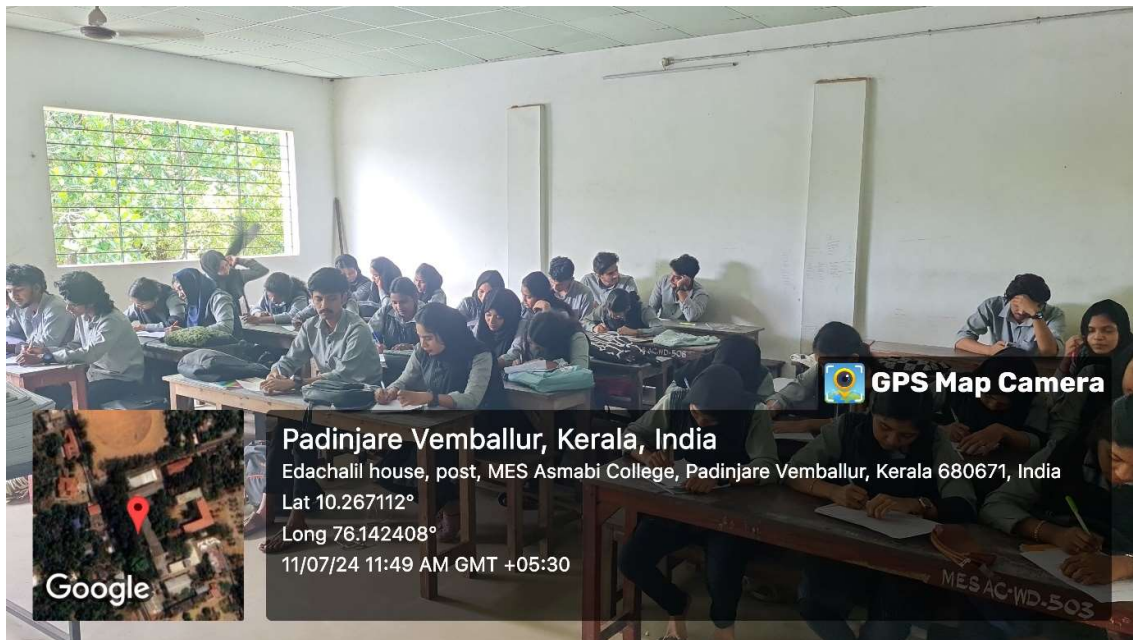
Essay Competition:
