A guided tour of the Mana provided insights into the historical and cultural significance of the location. An expert talk by Rajkumar Namboothiri, the 6th generation of Sangramagrama Madhavan was conducted to elaborate on Madhava's works, including his groundbreaking infinite series for π and other trigonometric functions, followed by an interactive Q&A session.

After lunch, the group visited nearby cultural landmarks to better understand the socio-cultural context in which Madhava lived and worked. In the afternoon, a reflection session allowed students to share their insights, and teachers noted the enthusiasm and curiosity sparked by the visit.
